EFN Golf Classic

This corporate golf tournament is held each May and includes EFN and DSBN suppliers, partners and supporters as well as DSBN Administrative and Head Office Staff. Since its inception in 2007, the event has raised \$120,000 and the funds are earmarked for operational and program needs.



EFN Holly Jolly Celebration

This event is designed for EFN and DSBN suppliers, partners and supporters, DSBN staff members, the non-profit community, parents and friends of the Foundation. Held each November since 2007, this event attracts an close to 400 people and has raised over \$50,000 for operational and program needs.

Prom Project Niagara

In the spirit of community sharing and support, this project celebrates the achievements of high school and elementary school students who have overcome adversity in reaching the milestone of graduation. This event assists those students that may have economic difficulties attending their prom or graduation event by providing free formal attire so they may attend their special day. Since 2008, the event has collected well over 3000 dresses and suits and has outfitted almost 300 students from across the Niagara Region.



DSBN Staff Retiree Reunion

As part of our community outreach program, this event attracts retired and current DSBN staff including teachers, administrators, support staff and management and is held at Henley Island in the fall.

DSBN Road Race

This annual event includes a 1 km Fun Run and a 5 km Road Race which attracts well over 1000 participants from the Niagara Region including: DSBN students, employees and family members. Since the event's inception, the DSBN Road Race has raised over \$80,000.



Make Change for Children

The EFN's Make Change for Children Campaign is a week-long fundraiser held in February across the Niagara Region. Funds are raised through a variety of ways, all benefiting EFN's Poverty and Emergency Relief Fund. This fund was set up by the EFN in 2008 to support extraordinary, emergency, personal or school-related needs of individual students brought about by financial hardship. Basic needs are met, including nutritional support, medical fees and clothing.
