Thanks to Don Fretz, Larry Sirianni and Ardeth Staz, EFN is funding more school projects and more student needs. A combined \$1500.00 was donated to EFN used to fund the Program Enhancement Grants allocated in October of this year. We are very fortunate to have DSBN staff donating proceeds of their final celebration with their peers, co-workers and friends.

Donations of Note

Sobeys Ontario Supports Breakfast Programs

A recent grant of \$3,000 was awarded to the EFN to support public school breakfast programs in Niagara. Sobeys Ontario grants funds to support breakfast programs provincially and locally. The funding was dedicated to South Lincoln High School, St. Catharines Collegiate, Port Weller Public School in St. Catharines and Garrison Road Public School in Fort Erie. In addition to supporting our nutrition programs, Sobeys staff can be seen volunteering at these local schools to provide even more support to their community.

EFN has granted over \$80,000 to nutritional programs in DSBN schools in three years, representing a small portion of the actual need that exists in Niagara. Without traditional support, schools must fundraise, apply for grants and work with community organizations to support their school community need. Friends of the Environment Foundation



In his 35 years of teaching, Frank has held the role of teacher, principal, consultant, coordinator and university professor. Frank Glew has written and published many books and is most known for his primary environmental books promoting literacy and environmental science education. The author's main thrust now is presenting his picture books to students in their own school library.

TD Friends of the Environment fund environmental literacy and is matched by Frank Glew! Famous for his environmental literacy for primary grades, Frank Glew is fast becoming the most popular primary grades literary reader in Ontario.

> All across the country, the TD Friends of the Environment Foundation funds a wide variety of unique and exciting grassroots initiatives created by Canadians dedicated to preserving and protecting our environment. Both South East and North Chapters granted funds to DSBN school projects.

> Environmental literacy is a hot topic these days as schools work toward integrating environmental issues and learning opportunities into their curriculum.

The EFN provides financial support to mini projects in DSBN schools and the focus is environmental education since receiving over \$17,000 in funding as a joint effort between TD Friends of the Environment Foundation and Canadian environmental author Frank Glew. As a result, over 1200 books were distributed to 25 elementary schools around Niagara and 6 schools were the recipient of a Frank Glew visit to their students.

Canadian Federation of University Women - St. Catharines donate \$500 to DSBN School Theatre access programs

This service club donates to all sorts of programs in St. Catharines and have created a fund called "Gift of Theatre" program where they wanted their donation earmarked to assist children in this area. As as a result students at Lincoln Centennial Public School were awarded the fund and Carousel Players were booked for a special performance at the school.

For 38 years Carousel Players has toured their creative productions into Niagara schools, offering young children their first live theatre experience. Saving Lonesome George for children in Grades JK to 3 invites children to participate in an adventure to save a turtle from extinction and to act to help the environment. Danny, King of the Basement for Grades 4 to 8 gets students thinking about issues of poverty, literacy and how family stresses can impact on success at school.

Make Change for Children 2010 Campaign

The Make Change for Children is heading into the second annual campaign and EFN hopes that all 2008 and 2009 donors will continue to support this much needed funding support mechanism.

The campaign has raised over \$60,000 and disbursed just as much to our student needs.

All funds are dedicated to the Poverty and Emergency Relief Fund for Schools to help children in areas of winter clothing, boots, school access fees, field trips, medications, and post-secondary applications, to name a few.

Assisting individual students by equalizing access to education regardless of their economic constraints, over 1600 students have been supported since February 2008.
